Women's Ministry Bible Study On Psalm 119

The book of Psalms has been a delight and blessing to the people of God for a hundred generations. Many of its 176 verses you probably know well. **"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." Psalm 119:105 "Your word I have hidden in my heart, that I might not sin against You." Psalm 119:11 and many more.** We are excited to be starting a 3 year Study on Psalm 119. This year we will be covering verses 1-56, next year Psalm 119:57-112, and the following year Psalm 119:113-176. We want to take our time studying it, meditating on its verses and digesting its meaning so it becomes part of our lives. We hope you can join us!

"In many ways the 119th Psalm is one of the most remarkable chapters in the Bible. With 176 verses, it is by far the longest chapter in the Bible. Practically every verse is a testimony to the value of the Scriptures, a fact which is all the more remarkable since the writer of the psalm had only a small portion of the complete Bible available in his day. If the Scriptures were such a blessing to him, how much more should they be to us! The primary message of Psalm 119 is: the holy Scriptures are profitable in every way and able to meet every need in time and eternity. The psalm is divided into 22 stanzas of 8 verses each. Each of the 22 stanzas is headed by one of the 22 letters of the Hebrew alphabet. The psalm takes on beautiful significance if one will read it as sort of a spiritual diary, written at various times during the long life of the believer, one who has experienced many and varied circumstances of life, but has found the Word of God able to give guidance and victory in all situations. With this concept in mind, let us journey through his diary, comparing his circumstances with our own today, and noting with him that God can meet every need through His Word." (*Treasures in the Psalms* by Henry Morris)

"The psalm is largely a collection of prayers and meditations on the Word of God. The psalmist was persecuted by men of rank and authority, who ridiculed his beliefs, seeking to put him to shame and make him give up his faith. But he strengthened himself by meditating on the Word of the Lord, which to him was his comfort, his prized possession, his rule of life, and his resource for strength—all of which drove him to desire it even more." (*The Bible Knowledge Commentary*)

Oh how we need that same source of strength from the Word in the world we are living in today! We are excited about studying Psalm 119 together. Someone once said that, "A well-marked Bible means a well-fed soul."

Introduction Night to Psalm 119

September 27th will be our Introduction Night to Psalm 119 and we will have a Guest Speaker, Dr. Dominick Hernández, who speaks Hebrew and is an associate professor of Old Testament and Semitics at Talbot School of Theology, Biola University in California. Join us from 7:15-9:00 PM, doors open at 6:45 PM.



Dr. Dominick Hernández was born in New York City, NY, yet spent most of his formative years living in Warminster Heights (Lacey Park), PA. During his early teenage years, he became interested in athletics, music, learning languages, and especially, studying the Bible.

Despite his appreciation for the Bible, he did not immediately delve into the discipline of biblical studies. Dr. Hernández always wanted to be an educator which was a desire that initially led him into health and physical education

with intent of coaching and teaching. This prompted him to attend West Chester University in Pennsylvania where he studied a Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology. He then continued his education at the Teachers College Columbia University where he focused on curriculum and teaching in the biobehavioral sciences and eventually earned a Master of Arts degree in physical education.

While studying at Columbia University, Dr. Hernández began attending a congregation that taught expositionally through the Bible. This experience fostered a desire in him to learn the Bible in its historical and linguistic contexts so that he too might be able to teach in both academic and congregational contexts. From this point on, his vocational pursuits focused on attaining practical training as well as achieving excellence in academia. From 2006-2008, he received ministerial training at the Calvary Chapel School of Ministry in Costa Mesa, CA. During his time at the School of Ministry, he was ordained at Voyage Calvary Chapel in Fountain Valley, CA (2008) and served as the congregation's youth pastor.

After the School of Ministry, he continued his studies at Princeton Theological Seminary, focusing on the Old Testament/Hebrew Bible, and was awarded a Master of Divinity degree in the spring of 2011. This educational experience opened the doors for doctoral studies at Bar-Ilan University in Ramat Gan, Israel where he concentrated on Biblical Wisdom and Semitic Philology. He resided in Israel for five years during which he taught as an adjunct professor at Israel College of the Bible and participated in other English, Spanish and Hebrew language ministries. Dr. Hernández was officially awarded the Doctor of Philosophy degree in the fall of 2016.

He currently serves as an associate professor of Old Testament and Semitics at Talbot School of Theology, Biola University. Prior to arriving at Talbot, he served at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (Louisville, KY), and at Moody Bible Institute-Spokane, WA. Dr. Hernández is deeply invested in the academic community in which he continues to research, write, and present the Bible in its ancient Near Eastern context. He remains committed to the church, and currently preaches and gives seminars in congregations.

He has been married to Gaby for the past twenty years and together they have two children, Yair (11) and Yael (6). The Hernández family currently resides in Los Angeles, CA.

Women's Ministry Bible Study On Psalm 119

We invite ladies, Jr. High age and older to attend our once-a-month Women's Bible Study from September-May (no Study in April). Registration is not required to attend. The Study will not be live-streamed but all of the Studies will be posted on the church website and app. Go to **resources.ccphilly.org** and click on Women's Ministry.

The format for the Study will be worship, teaching, small group discussion and prayer time. After the teaching, we will have small discussion groups that meet at tables in various locations to discuss what God spoke to our hearts about Psalm 119 and to pray together. Each month you may choose to sit at any table you would like that has seats available. You do NOT need to register to be in a discussion group as we have done in previous years.

NEW THIS YEAR!

This year we will be offering 2 new discussion groups specifically for Widows and Moms, including Moms with infants not yet crawling. We are sorry, but no childcare will be provided and children are not permitted to attend with the exception of infants not yet crawling.

DISCUSSION GROUP FOR WIDOWS:

If you are a widow and would like to be in a discussion group to meet other widows and to encourage one another through this season of life, we are offering this group to you. You do not have to be in this group, you can go to a regular discussion group.

DISCUSSION GROUP FOR MOMS & MOMS WITH INFANTS NOT YET CRAWLING:

If you are a Mom and would like to be in a discussion group to meet other Moms, we are offering this group to you. You do not have to be in this group, you can go to a regular discussion group. If you are a Mom with an infant, not yet crawling, you may bring your baby to the Bible Study in the Sanctuary and to this discussion group. If you bring your infant, we do ask that you only join the Moms' discussion group.

We will have a section reserved for you in the Sanctuary and you may bring your strollers. If you are in the Sanctuary with your baby during the Study and your baby gets fussy or needs to be fed, please take him/her out of the Sanctuary. We have provided the Jr. High Room for you to nurse/feed your baby with a closed circuit TV where you can continue to watch the Study live. No other children except infants not yet crawling will be permitted to attend and no childcare is provided so you will need to keep your baby with you.

Homework:

Prior to the first Study, read the Introduction in the Psalm 119 Journal. This Scripture writing journal might be a new way of studying the Word for some of you. In this Introduction, you will find helpful tips and suggestions for Scripture writing, but the overall intention of this journal is to be a flexible and practical tool to help you develop your own system of writing Scripture.

The sample journal entry is just that, only a sample. You do not have to write out all the verses and then study them, you can write them out one at a time and put your thoughts under each one which will give you more room to write about each verse.

This is your own personal journal, no one will be checking it, but you may use it to share what God showed you if you choose to be in a discussion group at church. Or you can use this journal for your own personal Study or do it with friends.

Homework

Some suggestions as you study each month:

- 1. Pray and ask the Lord to speak to you through His Word.
- 2. Read the 8 verses in the Bible we will be studying each month. Take your time and meditate on each verse, we want God to speak to you personally.
- 3. Put the date at the top of the page in your journal, this will help you remember what God told you on the date you studied it. You do not need to journal every day if you're busy, just continue the next day that you have time.
- 4. Write out in your journal the first verse of the 8 verses you are studying. Writing out the verse will help you remember it and maybe even memorize it.
- 5. On the verse you just wrote in your journal, you could highlight, underline, or circle any words or parts of the verse that have particular meaning to you. You can also look up definitions of the words. A Study Bible is a great tool because it has footnotes and cross references that will help you learn more about each verse. Write the things that God shows you in your journal.
- 6. Asking yourself questions or praying about what the verse says helps you apply the Word to your life. For example: Psalm 119:2 says, "Blessed are those who keep His testimonies, Who seek Him with the whole heart!" Question: "Lord, do I seek you with my whole heart? Prayer: "Please help me seek you more!"
- 7. Repeat the same things with the other 7 verses.
