

## **Women's Ministry Tuesday Evening Bible Study**

We will begin a 2 year Study in the Epistle to the Galatians. This year we will be studying Galatians Chapter 1 through 4:18. The Studies are held once-a-month on Tuesday Evenings from September to May (no Study in April). The Study dates, homework and speakers are on page 3. After the teaching, we will have optional Small Discussion Groups that meet in various locations to discuss the verses we studied that month and pray together. When you come to the Study, you will need to register to be in a Small Discussion Group, see page 5 for registration information.

We invite ladies, Jr. High age and older, to attend the Women's Bible Study. We are sorry, but no childcare will be provided and children are not permitted to attend with the exception of infants not yet crawling whose Moms will only be able to attend the Moms' Group in the Nursery Hallway.

## The Epistle to the Galatians Introduction

The great theme of Galatians is that of justification by faith without the works of the law. Furthermore, we are not only saved by grace but kept by grace—not by works. Galatians extols Christian liberty—freedom in Christ. Liberty is not libertinism, "use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh," Paul wrote, "but by love serve one another" (Galatians 5:13).

Legalism in any form—whether circumcision, or ritualism or anything else—will neither save a sinner nor perfect a saint. The Christian life is not controlled by commandments but by the Holy Spirit. "Walk in the Spirit" (Galatians 5:16). That is the message of Galatians for the Christian believer.

The word "gospel," both in English and in Greek, means "good news," not "good works" or "good advice." It is the good news concerning the person and work of Jesus Christ, with the forgiveness and salvation He provides—not information concerning the divine laws we must keep to be saved, as the men troubling the Galatian churches were teaching.

"I marvel that you are turning away so soon from Him who called you in the grace of Christ, to a different gospel, which is not another; but there are some who trouble you and want to pervert the gospel of Christ." Galatians 1:6-7

The word "another" in verse 6 is *heteros*, meaning "another of a different kind." That is, the only true gospel is centered on "the grace of Christ." In verse 7, on the other hand, the word for "another" is *allos*, which means "another of the same kind." Verses 6 and 7 stress that the so-called gospel that was misleading the Galatians was not really one with just minor variations from the true gospel but was altogether opposite to it, a false gospel.

## Homework

Each month we encourage you to read the assigned verses in Galatians that we are studying along with the corresponding chapter in "Be Free" by Warren Wiersbe. You do not need to do the "Questions for Personal Reflection or Group Discussion" at the end of each chapter in "Be Free." We will be using the same homework format we did for our Psalm 119 Study which is described below.

#### How to do the Galatians Study:

- 1. Pray and ask the Lord to speak to you through His Word. Put the date at the top of the page in your journal.
- 2. Read the verses in Galatians that we will be studying each month. Take your time and meditate on each verse, and let God speak to you personally.
- 3. Read the assigned chapter in "Be Free" by Warren Wiersbe. Underline or highlight anything that ministers to you.
- 4. Write out the first verse in your journal of the verses assigned each month. Writing out the verse will help you remember it. On that verse you could highlight, underline, or circle any words or parts of the verse that have particular meaning to you. You could also look up definitions of words. A Study Bible is a great tool because it has footnotes and cross references that will help you learn more about each verse. Write down the page number of anything from "Be Free" that ministered to you from that verse.
- 5. Repeat number 4 with the rest of the assigned verses for that month.

## Register to be in a Small Discussion Group

- 1. If you would like to be in a Small Discussion Group, **registration is required**. Please do not go to a group without registering to be in that group. Even if you were part of a Small Discussion Group last year, you still need to register again this year.
- 2. In order to register, you must come to the Study and register in person. You will not be able to email or call us to register. Registration will take place at a booth in the front foyer before the Study begins from 6:45-7:10 pm and again after the teaching from 8:20-8:25 pm.
- 3. Once you register to be in a group, the registration ladies will give you a nametag with that group # on it so when you go to the group, the leaders will know that you have registered for their group.
- 4. When a group is full, no one else can register for that group.
- 5. If you registered to be in a group but are no longer able to attend the Bible Study, please contact Women's Ministry and let us know so we can remove you from the group. ## **Small Discussion Groups**

We will have 9 Small Discussion Groups throughout the building and 2 groups specifically for Moms and Widows. All of the groups will be studying Galatians 1-4:18 together. There will be a map showing where all of the groups are located when you come to the Study to register for a group.

#### 1. Discussion Group for Widows:

This group will meet in the Sanctuary (previously met in the Koinonia Room). If you are a widow and would like to be in a discussion group to meet other widows and to encourage one another through this season of life, we are offering this group to you.

## **Small Discussion Groups**

#### 2. Discussion Group for Moms & Moms with infants not yet crawling:

This group will meet in the Nursery Hallway. If you are a Mom and would like to be in a discussion group to meet other Moms, we are offering this group to you. If you are a Mom with an infant, not yet crawling, you may bring your baby to the Bible Study in the Sanctuary and to this discussion group only. Feel free to bring your baby into the Sanctuary during the teaching and sit in the back by the Prayer Room. If your baby gets fussy or needs to be fed, please take him/her out of the Sanctuary. You may go to the Nursing Moms' Room located in the Nursery Hallway to feed your baby. There will be a closed circuit TV in there where you can continue to watch the Study live. This is the only discussion group that you may bring your infant to, no other children will be permitted to attend and no childcare is provided so you will need to keep your infant with you.

Calvary Chapel of Philadelphia began in 1981 when Pastor Joe Focht started a small Bible study in a catering hall. With a strong emphasis on teaching God's Word verse by verse, the church has grown to minister to around 7,000 people weekly with a variety of outreaches and ministries. Pastor Joe currently teaches three Sunday morning services. His daily Bible teaching ministry,

"Straight from the Heart," is heard in Philadelphia on 560 AM WFIL -7:30AM weekdays. In over 40 years of ministry on the East Coast, more than 20 church plants have come out of CC Philly.

Cathy was saved in 1971 during the Jesus Movement in California and went to Calvary Chapel Costa Mesa where Chuck Smith was her pastor. Joe and Cathy were married in 1978 and have been married for 47 years. Since the church began, Cathy has been the Women's Ministry Director overseeing the Women's Bible Studies and Special Events along with the ladies on her Women's Ministry Board. Joe and Cathy have 4 children and 8 grandchildren. Psalm 119:105 says, "Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." They love God's Word and it has been their guide these many years of ministry.

Women's Ministry will be collecting money for Calvary Chapel Word of Life for their outreaches and ministries to the people of Philadelphia. Donation boxes will be out at the Bible Study on the round kiosk. Last year we were able to give Calvary Chapel Word of Life \$588.69. Thank you for giving so generously!

Calvary Chapel Word of Life was born out of a Bible Study in the YMCA in North Philadelphia led by Pastor Mark Abrams. This study was simply a group of believers coming

together who had a hunger for the truth. The desire and emphasis of this ministry was to teach through the entire Bible verse-by-verse, as Paul told those in Ephesus, "For I have not shunned to declare to you the whole counsel of God" Acts 20:27. This small Bible study continued to grow as the Word of God was being taught and became a church plant. Seeking to reach the community with the gospel, the Lord afforded this fellowship the privilege to do countless outreaches serving single moms, fatherless children and the homeless. Calvary Chapel Word of Life has formed several partnerships with homeless shelters - Self-Incorporated, one of the city's largest homeless shelter agencies in the city, and Woodstock Shelter that services homeless married couples with children.
